DSAuk Members Shine in Glasgow

DSAuk members enjoyed an outstanding 2026 Commonwealth Games in Glasgow, delivering medal-winning performances across para powerlifting and para swimming.

Mark Swan made history by winning the first gold medal of the Games in the men's lightweight para powerlifting with a 222kg lift. Matt Harding claimed silver in the heavyweight event, while Olivia Broome secured bronze in the women's lightweight competition. Finlay Davidson and Commonwealth debutant Charlotte McGuiness also impressed with fifth-place finishes in their respective events.

In the pool, Bruce Dee added to DSAuk's success by winning bronze for Team England in the Men's 50m Freestyle S7.

Congratulations to all our athletes, whose dedication, determination and outstanding performances made it a memorable Games and showcased the incredible talent within DSAuk.
